Suggested Abilities

- ▶ 8th grade English reading, writing, speaking, and listening
- ▶ Understand basic algebra

Prerequisites

- ▶ Successfully pass the entrance exam or provide acceptable documentation of reading level
- ▶ Must be 18 or older by semester 3 & 4
- ▶ Must provide high school diploma, or equivalent certification for employment
- ▶ *High School Students: Meet with a counselor for eligibility requirements*

SEMESTER 1

DEA 1011 Introduction to Dental Practices

1 credit

History, legal and ethical responsibilities, and functions of professional dental team roles.

DEA 1012 Dental Science I

3 credits

Oral structures as they apply to oral histology, embryology, morphology, pathology, dental anatomy, and dental charting.

DEA 1015 Infection Control

3 credits

Infection and disease transmission in dental offices: microorganisms, sterilization, and hazardous communication.

DEA 1016 Medical Emergencies in Dental Office

2 credits

Reading vital signs, CPR for healthcare providers. Recognizing, preventing, and managing dental-office medical emergencies. Includes CPR certification training.

DEA 1024 Dental Radiography

3 credits

Focuses on the science of radiography, the application of radiographic techniques, and aseptic techniques.

SEMESTER 2

DEA 1014 Dental Science III

3 credits

Oral pathologies, microorganisms, pharmacology for oral pain/treatment, and laboratory procedures for anesthesia.

DEA 1021 Principles of Clinical Practice

3 credits

Four-handed dentistry techniques, instrument identification, tray setup armamentarium, and sterilization and aseptic procedures.

DEA 1023 Dental Materials I

3 credits

Includes fundamentals of dental materials as they apply to clinical and laboratory applications.

DEA 1031 Prevention and Nutrition in Dentistry

3 credits

Preventive dentistry techniques: fluoride application, oral home care instruction, nutrition and diet counseling, and coronal polishing.

SEMESTER 3

DEA 1033 Dental Materials II

3 credits

Includes type, compositions, and uses of elastomeric impression materials and the fabrication of custom impression trays and temporary crowns.

DEA 1035 Dental Office Management

3 credits

Includes office management and clerical practices, scheduling appointments, completing daily records, insurance and tax forms, bookkeeping and recall systems, and ordering supplies.

DEA 1080 Clinical Internship

3 credits

Includes the opportunity for clinical application of dental assisting techniques in a dental office or clinical setting as part of the American Dental Association's requirement of 300 clinical internship hours.

DEA 1081 Clinical Internship I

2 credits

Includes the opportunity for clinical application of dental assisting techniques in a dental office or clinical setting as part of the American Dental Association's requirement of 300 clinical internship hours.

SEMESTER 4

DEA 1013 Dental Science II

3 credits

Human anatomy and physiology focused on the head and neck for dental assisting: maxilla, mandible, processes, foramina, sutures, and major nerves and blood vessels.

DEA 1022 Specialties in Dentistry

2 credits

Tray setups for periodontics, endodontics, and prosthodontics. Pediatric dentistry, oral surgery, and implants.

DEA 1034 Advanced Dental Radiography

3 credits

intra- and extra-oral radiograph techniques for adults, children, edentulous, and special-needs patients; dental anatomy interpretation, aseptic procedures, and hands-on practice.

DEA 1082 Clinical Internship II

4 credits

Focuses on clinical practice in private or public dental offices or clinics with clinical work experience in both general dentistry and specialty fields on a rotating basis.
